## MAYOR'S SPACE

The nice thing about living in a Republic, the whole adult population of Dallas doesn't have to trundle to City Hall twice a month to attend a town hall meeting to govern the place. This trouble is saved by the tidy fashion of electing a City Council to represent the body politic of our community.

In one of its dutiful moments, the Council recently voted 9-0 to purchase the Radio Shack building. The City now owns nearly the square block where our emergency services are stationed, right handy to City Hall.

Much recommends the purchase – it is the right deal at the right time. Capital investment is how cities and businesses grow and change with the times. Ultimately, it is a bet on our future, that Dallas will prosper, requiring that emergency services – police, fire, ambulance, disaster management – all expand to keep up.

We are fortunate to live in a pluralistic society, so it's not shocking to hear that some folks don't agree with the purchase. Thus, for those sitting on the fence atwitter about this, here's some of the back story.

The City was approached by the owners who offered a very fair price and terms for the property. Their business was closing so no viable business would be displaced by the City's ownership. The building, built in 1950 is still in decent condition and is already being brought up to a modern standard with the intention of leasing it out to private enterprise in some fashion pending the City's future requirements for it. The City already needs and will use the parking lot (16 slots). And, looking far ahead, the City has already outgrown the convoluted space occupied by our Police Department and a new, right-sized facility somewhere on the emergency services block will eventually serve a great need.

It boils down to an abiding faith in our future and the sensible notion that our City needs the right tools in its kit bag to keep up, maintaining the excellent services we all cherish as part of Dallas life.

So, we bought the Radio Shack building.
