Two basketball hoops and a playground, which are visible from seating, are the main components of Birch Street Park. This neighborhood gathering spot is located in SW Dallas.




GALA PARK



This park encompasses a basketball court, playground, and grassy area. A gazebo with picnic tables provides shade.



KINGSBOROUGH PARK



This park contains open space for games, two basketball hoops, walking paths, a playground for children, and a creek.



ROTARY PARK



Nestled in northeast Dallas, this park features a half-court basketball, play structure, and a covered picnic area.



BARBERRY PARK



Tucked in the Barberry neighborhood, this park offers a bench, nature trail, and green space to enjoy.



Roger Jordan COMMUNITY PARK



This park consists of soccer fields, a skate park, a baseball field, two tennis courts, a paved walking path, a playground, and a picnic area.

DALLAS CITY PARK

LEVENS ST. ENTRANCE



The largest park in town, plays host to large community events and is a great place to hold gatherings. The park features two fireplaces, several sinks, one kitchen, about 100 picnic tables, numerous BBO pits, two sets of remodeled restrooms, and two shelters. In addition, there are seven horseshoe pits, five basketball hoops, three playground areas, and the Rickreall Creek. The park is also home to paved trails, an 18 Hole Disc golf course, an expansive Arboretum, and a Japanese garden.
