



PAVEMENT CONDITION MAP

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The City of Dallas has added an interactive street map to the City website. You can find the map at <http://www.dallasor.gov/streetmap>. The interactive street map is designed to show citizens and businesses the current conditions of individual City streets and the estimated costs to repair each street to a minimum standard.

Early summer 2014, the City of Dallas contracted with Infrastructure Management Services (IMS) to perform a Pavement Condition Assessment (PCA) of all City streets. IMS used the latest technology to complete the PCA. IMS used the data from the PCA to establish a Pavement Condition Index (PCI) score for each street in the City. The PCI is used to score streets from 1 to 100 with 1 being the worst possible score and 100 being the best possible score.

We hope City residents and businesses will visit the City’s website and use the interactive street map to determine the conditions of the streets they use most as well as the overall conditions of the City’s streets. The features of the interactive street map allow a person to see all the City streets color coded based on each street’s PCI score; to zoom in on a specific area or street; and to click on a specific street which will pop up an information box that provides the street’s PCI score and the estimated cost to repair the street to a PCI score of 80 or better.

Visitors to the webpage will find a detailed presentation on the work done by Infrastructure Management Services, City streets PCI scoring information, cost estimates to repair streets, and street condition forecasts if steps are not taken to repair streets. Visitor will also find information regarding street conditions such as rutting, alligator cracking, and longitudinal cracking that they are likely to see in Dallas City streets.

MAYOR'S SPACE

The rather famous author, Ms. Le Guin, visited downtown Dallas a few months ago to give us one of her rare and inspiring lectures. She traveled in on our main arterials and was doubtless impressed. However, had she ventured into the labyrinth of our residential streets, her positive view of our beloved community might have changed to something like: "My, my – your roads..."

Engineers rate street condition on a scale of 1 to 100, the higher, the better - Pavement Condition Index (PCI) they call it. A PCI of 70 on up is at least good. Below that, well..,my, my.

In 2002, Dallas streets had an average PCI of 78. In 2009, the PCI was down to a 72, barely good. Last year, it was 69, the beginnings of fair to bad. Fortunately, our main roads (arterials and collectors) are in pretty good shape due largely to the Council's emphasis. But our local streets are another story with a PCI that has slipped to 65. In engineer speak, in need of a "medium to thick overlay." In accountant speak, "expensive repairs."

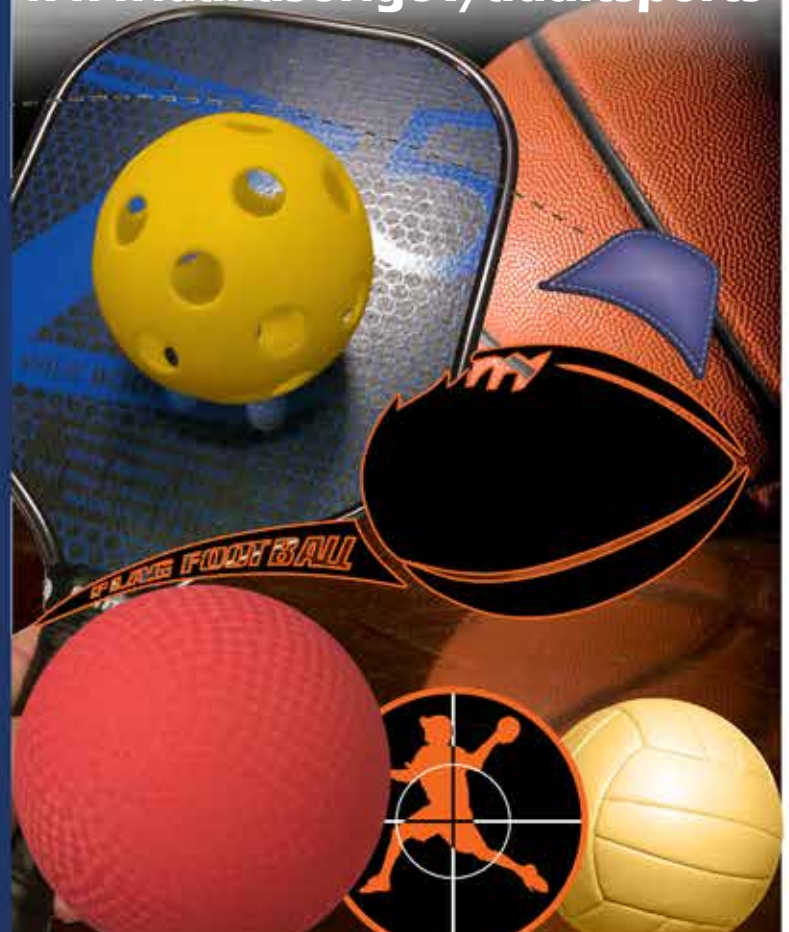
A 9-member Citizens' Advisory Committee, meeting monthly for over two years on this vexing problem, recommends the City place a bond measure on the ballot of \$10,000,000 to begin rebuilding our streets back to something like we had circa 2002. Urgency dictates placing the bond measure on the ballot in May 2016, this after a thorough presentation to the community regarding the pleasantness of driving on streets that are not likely to destroy your car.

The Wall of Honor is not limited to members of the Department, in fact, the nominee may also be a distinguished citizen such as an elected or appointed public official or any citizen, who has contributed in an outstanding manner to the fire department or the communities' fire and emergency services.

2015 INDUCTEES

Frank "Harpy" Bovard

Harpy joined the City of Dallas Fire Department in 1941. As soon as he joined the Department it became Harpy's family and his life. Harpy lived at the fire station for many years and served as the caretaker of the station and the equipment. Harpy served as the Association's Sergeant at Arms for over two decades.
