All our departments will be there to showcase the services they provide our residents. It's a great place to find out what your tax dollars provide, and to give us your input on existing programs and planned activities.

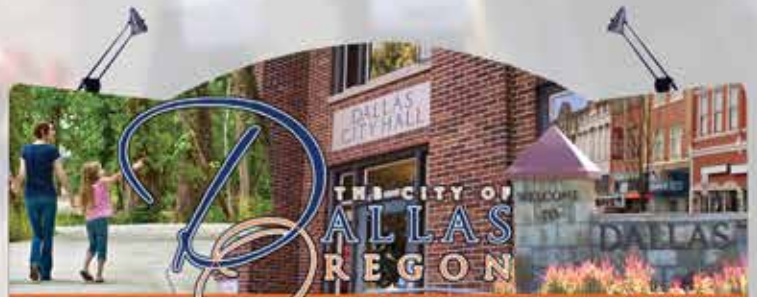
Visitors will have a chance to see equipment from the

PLAY IN THREE DIFFERENT EVENTS:

BOCCE BALL

The object of the game is to get your balls closest to the palina. The team with the bocce ball closest to the palina is the only one that scores points in a round, and one point is awarded for each ball that is closer to the palina than the opposing team. Two points are given for each ball that touches the palina. The usual goal is 12 points, but this can be changed to create a longer or shorter game.

CORNHOLE

The object of the game is to throw bean bags and score by landing a bag on the board or through the hole. The points of the low-scoring player are subtracted from the high-scoring player to reach the final point count for the round. This player then starts the throws for the next round from the other platform. The game is played to a point total of 21.

DISC GOLF

The object of the game is to traverse a course from beginning to end in the fewest number of throws of the disc.
