Saturday Dec 15/Sunday Dec 16

The City of Dallas recognizes the need for fall leaf pick-up. We are excited to announce that Republic Services is once again providing leaf collection to the citizens of Dallas. This year, Republic Services will be collecting leaves from City streets on the above listed dates.

It is important not to rake leaves into City streets until just before the collection event. Leaves raked into the street can cause drainage and flooding problems by clogging gutters and storm sewers, and can blow onto neighboring properties. Residents will be asked to remove leaves if they are raked into the street outside of scheduled pick-up times.

Leaf Disposal

The City of Dallas officials recommend that residents dispose of leaves in an environmentally responsible way.

- Use them as mulch in your landscaping
- Place them in your yard debris bin
- Use any of the leaf only drop-off locations from October 15 thru December 31 (no other yard debris).

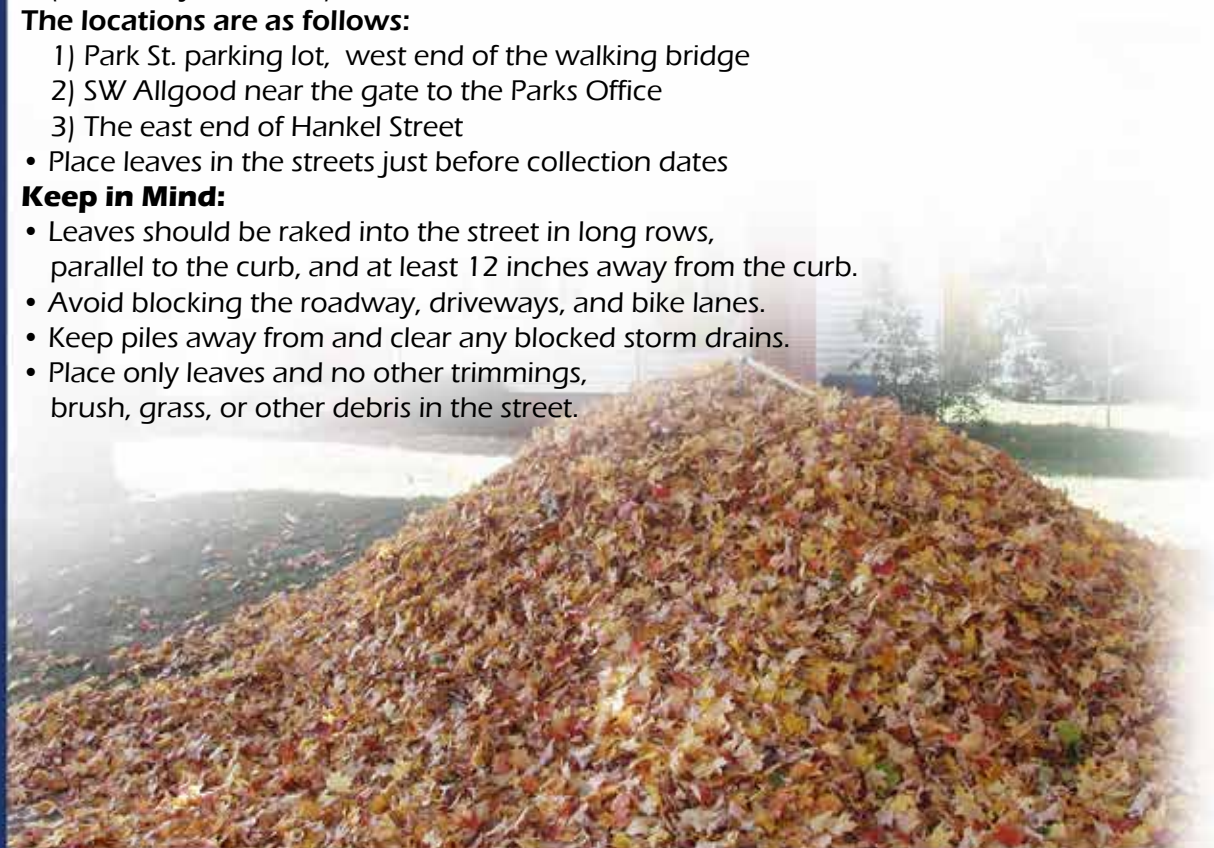
The locations are as follows:

- 1) Park St. parking lot, west end of the walking bridge
- 2) SW Allgood near the gate to the Parks Office
- 3) The east end of Hankel Street

- Place leaves in the streets just before collection dates

Keep in Mind:

- Leaves should be raked into the street in long rows, parallel to the curb, and at least 12 inches away from the curb.
- Avoid blocking the roadway, driveways, and bike lanes.
- Keep piles away from and clear any blocked storm drains.
- Place only leaves and no other trimmings, brush, grass, or other debris in the street.



MAYOR'S SPACE

Years ago, recall when you asked folk in Salem about Dallas, they said things like, "I sure like it up in the Gorge" or "Cool, I have a cousin who lives in Ft. Worth." Nowadays, at least they say things like, "I've heard it's a cute little town and it is around here somewhere — I think."

That outsiders now vaguely realize we are on the planet, recall that not so many years ago there were something like 29 vacant commercial buildings and empty parking spaces galore downtown – park anywhere you liked. But now, if finding room for your F250 Superduty King Ranch Special with its Kingsville Antique Affect Leather Seating Surfaces is your plan, good luck without circling the block a time or two. If success is a parking problem, we're good.

Food, drink and entertainment are proving to be big lures. Just regard the restaurants and drinking establishments thriving in our historic buildings, like Tony's downtown for the past 100+ years and Karma Coffee for less than a month. Some are being reborn, like Corby's on Main Street. There is fine dining in Latitude, Mexican food in La Herradura (their little building is 68 years old), Dominos, Pressed (building is 98 years old), West Valley Taphouse, the remodeled new Courtyard Café, Dallas Cinema, Ugo's and Sassy's in the Gail Hotel. The newest of these remarkable buildings was built in 1953.

Perhaps the flagship of our revival is the about-to-be-back-from-near-death Blue Garden. In its 128-year old building, first it was the Bilyeu Garden Café circa 1920, then by 1923 the Blue Garden Confectionary and by 1928 it was simply the Blue Garden. The classic art-deco, now restored neon sign went up in the 1930s. Soon it will light up, open its doors and new generations will experience its charms.

So, all great places to eat, drink and be merry while soaking up a bit of history - emblematic of our revival. And we'll work at finding you a parking slot for your Boss Hawg pickup so you can enjoy the fun



PULSE POINT

In October of 2014, six Fire Departments in Marion, Polk and Lincoln Counties launched PulsePoint, a free mobile app that alerts registered users whenever a cardiac arrest occurs in a public place in their immediate vicinity.

Informed at the same time as emergency responders, bystanders are given detailed instructions, including the location of the nearest automated external defibrillator (AED), and can begin hands-only CPR until responders arrive.

Nearly 1000 people die every day in the U.S. from Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). The PulsePoint app empowers everyday citizens to provide life-saving assistance. Survivability depends greatly on receiving immediate CPR. PulsePoint will provide immediate notification to those nearby who can provide chest compressions to double or triple a victim's chance of survival.
