## **BUSINESS INCENTIVES**

The following are the standard incentives available to eligible (generally non-retail) businesses locating in any enterprise zone, subject to authorization, timely filings and criteria:

Construction-in-Process Enterprise Zone Exemption — For up to two years before qualified property is placed in service, it can be exempt from local taxes. (For most authorized business this provides broader benefit than the regular exemption for commercial facilities under construction.)

Three to five consecutive years of full relief from property taxes on qualified property, after it is in service.

Depending on the zone, local incentives also may be available (Dallas has additional incentives).

## **Façade Grant Programs**

#### **Downtown - General**

- Established in 2009
- Amount Available \$10,000
- Source: Revolving fund managed by Polk CDC
- Up to \$2,000/building with a 50% match
- 3 issued to date (\$6,000)

## 500-900 Block of Main Street

- Established in 2013 as part of Streetscape project
- Amount Available \$40,000
- Source: Budgeted in Urban Renewal budget
- Up to \$4,000/building with a 25% or 50% owner match depending on the eligible activity

1 issued to date (\$4,000)

#### Commercial Façade Improvement Loan Program

The City of Dallas offers a low-interest loan program specifically designed to improve the appearance of commercial buildings. Applicants are eligible for up to \$20,000 at a rate of 4% interest. Eligible projects include exterior rehabilitation and restoration, as well as painting, awnings, lighting, and signage. All applications will be subject to approval of City Manager upon the recommendation of the Community Development Director.

## **MAYOR'S SPACE.**

Snow and ice can be the bane of municipalities. Unless you live in places like North Dakota or Buffalo, snow is an infrequent visitor, valued for its novelty and beauty, but cursed for its inconveniences. Not that many folks enjoy slip sliding around out on the streets trying to get to work or to the Family Dollar store.

Our recent 12 inch snowfall was essentially a once in 25 years event. Some cities in Western Oregon just don't gear up for such things because they are so rare and expensive to tackle. The cost of snow removal equipment and stockpiling materials, sand and chemicals is just not a priority. Monmouth and Albany for instance do not own snow removal equipment.

Here in Dallas we take snow removal very seriously and devote resources in preparation. We have three dump trucks equipped with snowplows, we stockpile rock and sand and are equipped to lay down anti-ice chemicals.

All of these resources were employed very well during the recent snow event. Our trucks were out early before the snowfall hit, putting down the anti-ice chemicals which gave us a big head start. Then when the snow hit, our crews were out there plowing and sanding throughout the storm, essentially 24 hours a day. We got lots of compliments, virtually no complaints and very few accidents, which speaks well of their work.

One weakness is our capability to plow the side streets in the neighborhoods. We have some 55 miles of streets in Dallas mostly residential. The cost of preparing to plow and open the streets to the same level of the arterials and collectors would be prohibitive. It just wouldn't make good fiscal sense and I trust people understand that.

Recognizing that we can't plow all the side streets, our emergency services are there in the event of dire circumstances. Both the fire and EMS services responded vigorously to the community's needs during this crisis, again, providing 24 hour coverage.

Dallas stepped up to the plate on this one. We should feel awfully proud and safe in this environment. My hat's off to everyone who helped out in this emergency, the city staff, volunteers, and neighbors helping neighbors. That's what this community is all about and will be about into the future, snow or no snow.

## SIGN CODE PUBLIC HEARING

The City of Dallas Planning Commission will be holding a public hearing to receive comments regarding the proposed sign code. The hearing will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, March 11 in the City Hall Council Chambers. Written testimony will be accepted prior to and at the hearing, and time will be reserved for verbal testimony.

This is the culmination of a lengthy process to review and revise the sign code, which has not been significantly amended



## **BOUNTY MARKET**





#### REPORT A STREET LIGHT OUT.

Have you noticed your street light out? Maybe there's one that cycles off and on. Whatever the issue, it's easy to report the problem and get it fixed! All you need to do is call Public Works at 503.831.3562 and let them know 1) where the street light is (the address, cross street, and/or pole number) and 2) what the concern is. We'll take the information and let Pacific Power know so they can schedule to fix it. Depending on crew availability, the repairs are often done within as little as two weeks.
