## DALLAS ROTARY FOOD DRIVE

**Dallas Rotary Focuses on Local Hunger Relief**

The Dallas Rotary Club will hold a community-wide food drive to benefit Dallas Food Bank during the month of March. Non-perishable food donations will be accepted March 16, and throughout the month at numerous locations.

"We are especially interested in donations of peanut butter, tuna and other canned meat, shelf-stable milk, cereal and canned fruit," said Rotarian Jake Stamas, chair of the food drive subcommittee. "Children and adults need high-quality foods like these for good health."

Last year, Dallas families received more than 446,000 pounds of donated food (the equivalent of 371,763 meals) through local hunger-relief partners in the Marion-Polk Food Share network. Dallas Emergency Food Corp. (Dallas Food Bank) distributes the lion's share of food given to local families in need. On average, the food bank serves 135 families each month. Over a year's time, they and other hunger-relief partners, including Seventh Day Adventist Church and James 2 Community Kitchen, serve thousands of individuals.

The month of March is traditionally Rotary Food Drive month throughout Marion and Polk counties. This year, Dallas Rotary wants to engage more community members in the effort. In addition to the one-day drive on March 16, non-perishable donations may be dropped off throughout the month at numerous locations, including **Ceres Gleann, Citizens Bank, Columbia Bank, Dallas Aquatic Center, Dallas Chamber & Visitors Center, Dallas Chiropractic, Dallas City Hall, Dallas Police Department, Dallas Public Library, Faith Church, Harvest Crossfit, Karma Coffee & Bakery, State Farm—Mitch Ratzlaff, West Valley Taphouse and World Gym.**
